



Little Rhody Tech Tips

Spark Retarded: Never allow the engine to run for any length of time with the spark retarded because this creates a great amount of carbon to be deposited on the walls of the cylinders, combustion chambers, pistons, spark plugs, etc. The engine will not be developing its maximum power and will overheat.

Engine Noise: Noise in the Engine will be heard as "backfire" or "knocks". The spark could be too advanced or you could have a poor mixture of gasoline or clogged muffler or improper timing to name only a few.

Tight Fan Belt: Over tight adjustment of the fan belt wears the belt down and causes early failure of shafts and bearings in the fan, water pump and generator.

Fan Fit: The fan should fit tight on the hub. Any play at this point would cause the fan blade to vibrate and eventually break.

Flickering Headlamps: If both headlamps flicker, look for a loose connection or intermittent ground. If flickering is due to a loose connection, amperage reading should be less than normal while they are flickering. If flickering is due to an intermittent ground, the amperage reading should be greater than normal while the lights are flickering.

MAFFI Minute

Winter is approaching here in the Midwest, and the museum is still rapidly working on new and updated exhibits! Darwin Schafer donated a really special unrestored and fully original 1930 De Luxe Delivery (130) which was originally used by a funeral home for flowers. This will be used during Model A Days to demonstrate corn shelling since it has a power take-oU' system for a belt (though personally, I might try and sneak an ice cream maker on it!).



Andrew Oliver of Connecticut won the sweepstakes on the 1928 Phaeton, and Kris Wilson of Missouri won the rebuilt engine.

Now that the trustees have had a chance to go over the numbers for the 2025 Model A Days, it looks like it was a great success thanks to all our hobbyists who came to support the museum. There are plenty of ways to get involved with helping and still plenty of ways to donate to the museum between the My-A-Program, Brick Memorials, and even regular donations. As we get towards the Holiday Season, this is something great to keep in mind, especially for your local club.

They each either own or are restoring a Model A. At the moment there


may only be four of them, but these young men are so enthusiastic about the Model A that it is infectious — and bound to reach others.

From four different states, they had not met each other before, but they have already made plans to meet again at the MAFFI Museum in September 2028 for the Model A's 100th anniversary.






